I have been a float home owner in Bayview for 19 years. With all due respect, may I ask, what is this crazy news regarding changing the no wake zone in place at Bayview? Bayview is a floating home community. This is a very unique, historically preserved part of Idaho. Our floating homes and business's are a system connected together by electrical lines, power and sewer lines, attached to dock systems. The floating home community has stood the test of time due to the uniqueness of the bay and the relative calmness of the water movement. The large no wake zone is absolutely necessary in this instance for the system of structures to work. The larger no wake zone that protects our floating structures also has created an atmosphere conducive to small water craft.
